Semester Description:

This seminar offers an interdisciplinary introduction to digital technologies and their increasing presence in research and publishing in the humanities and social sciences. The course will survey the emergence of network society, the changing modes of digital production and dissemination of knowledge, scholarly use of new media, intellectual property, digital humanities, and digital curation. An array of digital practitioners will feature as guests. Students will work on a semester project and/or paper appropriate to their areas of interest. No technical expertise or prerequisites are needed.

DSMS 700 is the core seminar for the Certificate in Digital Scholarship and Media Studies offered by the Laney Graduate School. The course is open to library staff as well as graduate students.
